Any suffering to the animals shall be reduced to a minimum by applying adequate anaesthesia and/or analgesia and by carrying out the operation only at the most appropriate age by qualified/competent personnel.

Restricted Veterinary Practice - Bovine							
Disbudding of a calf latest within 15 days of birth (except where horns have not emerged or where calf is sick or weak).							
ANAESTHESIA AND/OR ANALGESIA MUST BE USED							
Dehorning only to be undertaken in exceptional circumstances by Veterinary Surgeon and always under 6 months of age –							
ANAESTHESIA AND/OR ANALGESIA MUST BE USED. Animals de-horned over the age of 6 months will lose their organic/in-							
conversion status.							
Non-surgical castration of a bull no more than 6 months of age. ANAESTHESIA AND/OR ANALGESIA MUST BE USED							
Animals castrated over the age of 6 months will lose their organic/in-conversion status.							
Castration through use of rubber ring is permitted within 8 days of birth. ANAESTHESIA AND/OR ANALGESIA MUST BE USED							
Restricted Practice – Sheep and Goats							
Disbudding of a sheep or goat within 8 days of birth. ANAESTHESIA AND/OR ANALGESIA MUST BE USED							
Non-surgical castration of a ram no more than 3 months of age. ANAESTHESIA AND/OR ANALGESIA MUST BE USED							
Non-surgical castration of a goat no more than 2 months of age. ANAESTHESIA AND/OR ANALGESIA MUST BE USED							
 If anaesthesia/analgesia is not being used for the following three practices please have your vet complete the box on the right 1. Castration through use of rubber ring (for both sheep and goats) is permitted within 8 days of birth. 2. NOTE:The trimming of beaks in relation to poultry is not permitted.Clipping wings in relation to bees (queens) is prohibited.

Transportation of animals:

Loading and unloading of animals shall be carried out without the use of electrical stimulation to coerce the animals. The use of allopathic tranquillisers, prior to or during transport, is prohibited.

Who can carry out these operations:

Competent Person

Being "competent" in relation to an operation or procedure means—

- (a) being familiar with,
- (b) having the necessary training and experience to successfully carry out,
- (c) having the technical skill to successfully carry out, and
- (d) having the requisite equipment to successfully carry out, the operation or procedure.

The operative must be the owner or person in actual possession of the animal or his or her employee acting under the direction of the owner or person; in actual possession of the animal, and that the procedure is part of, or incidental to, the normal husbandry and management of the animal.
